

Lincoln Baseball Player selected as the Nebraska American Legion Player of the Year



Trevon D. McGill of Lincoln has been selected as the 2011 Nebraska American Legion Player of the Year. Each year thousands of America's youth participate in American Legion Baseball across the State. This year Trevon D. McGill of Lincoln Pius X was selected above all others as the Nebraska American Legion Baseball Player of the Year. Trevon has shown extensive support to baseball, education and to his community. Selected as the Class B All-State Honorary Captain, Academic All-State and National Honor Society, Trevon also volunteers as an assistant baseball coach for youth baseball.
